APPLICATION FOR EMERITUS STATUS

Emeritus Members shall be those Fellows, Members, Resident Members or Affiliate Members who:

1. Have ten (10) years of membership with the Association and are fully retired from the practice of forensic science; or
2. Have ten (10) years of membership with the Association and are at least seventy (70) years old; or
3. Have five (5) years of membership with the Association and are disabled.

Designation as an Emeritus Member shall only be made upon approval of the Board of Directors. An Emeritus Member shall not be required to pay dues or assessments, but shall receive all general membership mailings and may receive Academic Forensic Pathology or such other journal as the Association may publish from time to time at members' rates upon request to the office of the Secretary-Treasurer.

CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT

As a means to promote the highest quality of professional and personal conduct of its members, the following constitutes the Code of Ethics and Conduct which is endorsed and adhered to by all members of the National Association of Medical Examiners:

- a. The physician members of the National Association of Medical Examiners shall conform to the published ethics of, and their interpretation by, the American Medical Association.
- b. Every member of the National Association of Medical Examiners shall refrain from exercising professional or personal conduct adverse to the best interests and purposes of the Association.
- c. Every member of the National Association of Medical Examiners shall refrain from providing any material misrepresentation of education, training, experience or area

of expertise. Misrepresentation of one or more criteria or membership in the NAME shall constitute a violation of this section of the code.

d. Every member of the National Association of Medical Examiners shall refrain from providing any material misrepresentation of data upon which an expert opinion or conclusion is based.

e. Except for the President and Chair of the Board of Directors, every member of the National Association of Medical Examiners shall refrain from issuing public statements which appear to represent the position of the Association without specific authority first obtained from the Board of Directors.

f. A member or affiliate member participating in or associated with the investigation of a criminal matter shall not make or participate in making an extrajudicial statement that a reasonable person would expect to be disseminated by means of public communication and that does more than state without elaboration:

(1) Information contained in a public record.

(2) That the investigation is in progress.

(3) The general scope of the investigation including a description of the offense and, if permitted by law, the identity of the victim.

(4) A request for assistance in apprehending a suspect or assistance in other matters and the information necessary thereto.

(5) A warning to the public of any dangers.

g. All applicants for membership and annual renewal of membership shall affirm by their signatures that they have read, understood, and endorsed the Code of Ethics and Conduct in Article Ten of the Bylaws.
