
Office of the Medical Examiner County of Cook



The Cook County Medical Examiner's Office (MEO) is the only Medical Examiner system in Illinois and covers Chicago and the neighboring suburbs with a jurisdiction of approximately 5.2 million people. The office handles a wide variety of cases, including overdoses, drownings, homicides, motor vehicle/train related fatalities, undiagnosed natural diseases, environmental exposures, fires, and work-related deaths.

Fellows have their own office, computer, microscope, and earn a salary akin to miniattending. They receive a comprehensive lecture series, including special seminars on infant head trauma and in-custody deaths. A histology slide series includes common diagnoses, interesting cases, and unknowns to keep up the fellows' microscope skills. Off-site rotations at NMS laboratories and the Illinois State Crime Laboratory help round out the toxicology and forensic science education.
