


THE CORONER'S OFFICE

Located in beautiful Boise, Idaho, the Ada County Coroner's Office has a staff of 26 employees, and supports the largest county in the State of Idaho. Investigating approximately 3,000-3,500 cases per year (pathology cases will not exceed case requirements designated by NAME). The office is professionally and efficiently administered by Coroner Dotti Owens. We have a highly trained, well-staffed forensic division of Forensic Pathologists (2.5), Forensic Supervisor (1) and Forensic technicians (3), a 24 hour investigative force of ABMDI registered Medicolegal Investigators (13), Anthropologist (1), and a superb Administrative Staff (5).

The Coroner's Office is NAME and IACME accredited. We are a regional center providing consulting and pathology services to 33 Idaho counties and 3 sovereign nations. Moving forward there will be growth in our office, new technologies and state of the art facility enhancements. This provides a unique opportunity for individuals to help create an environment of progress, modernity and research while maintaining the absolute highest standards of medical legal death investigation to the people of Ada County, and remaining an active partner in the community in which they serve.

We work in cooperation with and maintain strong professional relationships with Local, State and Federal Law Enforcement agencies, BLM, State Universities, State Epidemiologists and the CDC. Our office values community education and partnerships, with many of the Coroner's staff participating in education and outreach programs, speaking engagements in schools and various other professional, civic and community organizations.

The Ada County Coroner's Office has been an active partner in assisting the Idaho State Coroner's Association with obtaining ABMDI certification for our States Coroners. Coroner Owens provided the education to the association members, teaching classes in both Coeur d'alene and Idaho Falls. The education provided by Coroner Owens was essential in the success and as a result, 20 Coroners in the State of Idaho obtained there national certification.



THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate must be able to be a licensed physician in the State of Idaho and is required to be certified by the American Board of Pathology in anatomic pathology or board eligible in Forensic Pathology.

Comprehensive knowledge of anatomy, pathology, anthropology, and other related disciplines for identification and investigative purposes is required. In addition, the candidate must be skilled in performing autopsies and examining human bodies, providing expert testimony and advising the Prosecutors office in criminal proceedings relating to deaths.

Knowledge of firearms and other instruments of death, vehicular crash analysis, and rules of evidence and court procedures will be a vital asset in this candidate. In addition, the candidate would possess knowledge of criminal investigation methods and techniques and crime scene processing. Knowledge of Federal, State and local laws related to the operation of the Ada County Coroner's Office would be beneficial to the applying candidate.

The ability to respond effectively in a stressful emergency or crisis situation and to deal with people in a sensitive manner, is a unique and important part of this position. Candidate would willingly participate in peer review, covering for testimonies, and sharing daily
