

The Connecticut Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is seeking two Per-Diem Pathologists to support our increased examination caseload. Per-Diems will assist our office and our current staff of eight forensic pathologists by conducting autopsy examinations on weekdays (8 hour day), beginning as soon as reasonably possible.

Our free-standing, modern facility is located in Farmington, Connecticut on the Campus of the University of Connecticut Health Center and Medical School. The office is a state-wide medical examiner system with an autopsy load of approximately 2400 per year which includes approximately 100 homicides. Full-time investigators attend scenes and support staff include excellent mortuary technicians and photographers. Pathology residents from Yale, Hartford Hospital, and Danbury Hospital rotate through the office in addition to Pathologists' Assistant students from Quinnipiac University. Histology is done in house while toxicology is outsourced with an average turn-around-time of 12 days. There is a board-certified forensic anthropologist on staff and the medical examiners have access to consultants in pediatric pathology, neuropathology, cardiac pathology, radiology, and odontology. Reports are dictated to an outsourced dictation company with < 24 hour turnaround time.

The ideal candidate is a board certified Forensic Pathologist who has a minimum of 5 years full-time experience recently working in Forensic Pathology. A state of Connecticut Medical License is necessary to begin work; reimbursement of the licensure fee will be available upon completion of 3 months of work. Travel and lodging expenses are not covered.

The hourly rate of compensation is \$171.01 with a daily (8 hours) rate of \$1368.08. The hourly rate of compensation will increase to \$177.01 as of June 21, 2019 with a daily (8 hours) rate of \$1,416.08. The Per-Diem pathologist will perform no more than three (3) autopsy examinations per weekday. The Per-Diem will not handle homicide or infant examinations or other examinations with potential criminal investigation. The Per-Diem pathologist will be supervised by the Chief (Deputy) Medical Examiner regarding case assignments and case completion. A schedule of weekday assignments will be worked through on a monthly basis. Remote access to our network and the Case Management system will be provided.
